WE WILL BUILD A NEW VOCATIONAL SCHOOL.

“As many of you know Rosey has a sister school in Bamako, Mali. This school, Rosey-Abantara, was built, and its students are fully funded by the generous donations of Rosey parents, members of the AIAR, the Rosey Foundation, Friends of Rosey and even the Rosey students themselves and, obviously the school.

The school is doing better than the people who envisioned it could have ever imagined. There are now 200 more students who attend the school on scholarships. After the success of the main school, Rosey has decided to take its investment in Mali and its people to the next level.

Our new project is building a college on the land neighboring Rosey-Abantara that offers courses in subjects that reflect Mali’s growing tourist industry. The new college would offer classes in the hospitality industry and IT.

A college of this type is greatly needed because there is a new job market for people with these skills, but, right now, there are not enough people with the required skills to do the jobs. As the proverb says, “if you give a man a fish you feed him for a day but if you teach a man to fish you feed him for a lifetime.” This college would teach these people to fish so to speak. And, by training people in the hospitality industry and IT we not only give them the chance to earn a higher salary, which would improve their standard of living but also give them invaluable skills that they could then go on to teach their friends and family.

At Le Rosey-Abantara the modest tuition fees of about 300 euros per annum cover the school’s salaries and running costs. This is still too high a price for many families: for three years, therefore, we have been taking promising but needy students out of the public system, where they are squashed into classes of 80 to 100 pupils, and have instead offered them a scholarship for Le Rosey-Abantara where the conditions are much more favourable for education. Such a dream can become a reality for 400 students if every Roséen provides scholarship support for one child at Le Rosey-Abantara in Bamako. To do this we propose that each family of actual students make a gift of 1% of Le Rosey tuition fees, in other words, 920 CHF per annum, to cover one year’s schooling at Le Rosey-Abantara, as well as transport costs, meals, books and school uniform. Anciens are of course welcome to participate and sponsor children at Rosey-Abantara.


I am currently studying toward a PhD in the Department of Urban Planning at Harvard University. By integrating theoretical and methodological perspectives from anthropology, geography, architecture, and urban planning, my research explores the history and theory of urbanization and urban planning, with an empirical focus on contemporary China and a theoretical emphasis on the relationship between space and society. This fall, I presented a paper on residents' use of graffiti to express their resistance to demolition in a historic district of Chongqing, China; this spring, I will be presenting a paper on regional variation in the governance of village urbanization and the effect this variation has on residents' territorial identities. This summer, I will be beginning more extended research for my dissertation. This project will combine ethnographic and spatial analysis to investigate the rapid urbanization of Hailong village outside of Chongqing. By studying the changing conceptions and practices of both residents and urban planners, I will seek to understand the process of urbanization from the perspective of those who are themselves engaged in the village's transformation. In doing so, I hope to provide a new set of analytical tools for conceptualizing urbanization from the ground up – tools that may help us to better understand and improve varied urban phenomena in other parts of the world, such as the seemingly unbounded and fuzzy urbanism of the *zwischenstadt* in Europe or edgeless cities in the United States.



Shenzhen, Huanggang Village: One of China's wealthiest urban villages, Huanggang simultaneously maintains its ancestral roots while aspiring to become an urban real estate firm.



Chongqing: Demolition and redevelopment are omnipresent in China's western metropolis, Chongqing.



Guangzhou, Longmei Village: Over the course of ten years, Longmei has grown from 2,000 to 20,000 residents. Newly built mid-rise apartment buildings now crowd around Qing era ancestral homes.
